NOTICE FOR A PUBLIC FORUM / OPEN HOUSE

- What:** Public Forum / Open House about the site design options that the City Council will consider for the new Justice Center facility

- Why:** The Public Forum/Open House is to allow all concerned citizens the opportunity to review the four proposed options, and to provide their comments. These comments will be presented to the City Council by staff.

- When:** **February 9th, 5:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. in the Library Meeting Room at City Hall, 225 Fifth Street, Springfield.**

In November 2004, the citizens of Springfield approved a bond measure for the construction of a new facility to include the Police Department, Municipal Court and a 100 bed jail. The measure provided that the existing police/courts building would be removed and the new facility would utilize that property. It indicated that the new facility might require purchase of adjacent property and vacation of existing street right-of-way.

The project architect has now developed four options which provide for the space requirements of the new facility.

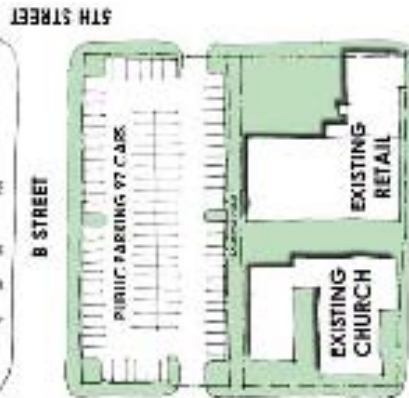
- Option 1:** Includes a 2.5 story Police/Court building along A Street with one level of underground parking. The new jail would face B Street. This Option requires the leasing of parking spaces from a church and retail building located on A Street.
- Option 2:** Includes a 2.5 story Police/Court building along B Street with the jail facing A Street. This Option closes a portion of B Street and a portion of 4th Street. This Option requires the leasing of parking spaces from a church and retail building located on A Street.
- Option 3:** Includes a 2.5 story Police/Court building along A Street and a jail building along A Street. This option requires the City purchase of the church and retail building currently located along A Street.
- Option 4:** Includes an L-shaped 2 story Police/Court building fronting 5th and B Streets. This Option requires the City purchase of the retail building on A Street.
